- A quiet space with a clear desk or table
- A stable broadband internet connection
- A laptop or desktop computer with a working microphone and webcam
- An up-to-date Chrome web browser is recommended.
- Install Zoom (<u>https://zoom.us/</u>), sign on and update before the exam
- Be sure you can share your screen.

Getting Your Testing Space Ready

- Close all other applications except your browser and Zoom.
- Disable any pop-ups or messages.
- Put all electronic devices such as cellphones in another room.
- You cannot wear an Apple Watch or other smart watch.
- Camera must clearly show your face and be able to display your ID documents.
- Test your camera at <u>http://zoom.com/test</u>



- At the start of your exam session you will be asked to hold up your ID to the webcam.
- The VE's will ask for a SLOW 360-pan of your working space including the floor and ceiling.
- You will then be asked to share your screen and your computer will be checked.

- Your camera and microphone must remain active through the session.
- If you have any questions during the exam, simply ask them verbally and the VE team will address any technical concerns you may have.
